## Jauhiainen Commended For Bravery

IRON RIVER, July 23—Staff Sgt. Donald Jauhiainen, recently decorated for meritorious service with the Fifth Air Force in Australia, was commended for bravery in a letter received here by his mother, Mrs. Tilda Jauhiainen, 517 Lay avenue, Iron River, from his commanding officer, Lieut. Gen. George C. Kenny.

The letter reads:

"Recently your son, Staff Sgt. Donald Jauhiainen, was decorated with the Air Medal. It was an award made in recognition of courageous service to his combat organization, his fellow American airmen, his country, his home and to you.

"He was cited for meritorious achievement while participating in an aerial fight over Kavieng Harbor, New England.

### America's Sons In War

"He was radio operator of a B-17 type aircraft on a night bombing mission against shipping in the vicinity of the harbor. Despite heavy anti-aircraft fire, bombs were dropped and two direct hits were scored on a destroyer. Almost every hour of every day your son and the sons of other American mothers, are doing just such things as that here in the Southwest Pacific.

"There is a very real and very tangible contribution to victory and to peace.

"I would like to tell you how genuinely proud I am to have such as your son in my Command, and how gratified I am to know that young Americans with such courage and resourcefulness are fighting our country's battle against the aggressor nations.

"You, Mrs. Jauhianinen, have every reason to share that pride and gratification."

"Sgt. Jauhiainen has been in the Southwest Pacific more than a year and has been in the service 24 months. He is a radioman on a Flying Fortress.

His brother, Second Lieut. Matt Jauhiainen, is with the Ordnance department in South America.

## Iron River Man Awarded Flying Cross

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS IN AUSTRALIA—CP—Staff Sgt. Donald Jauhiainen; of Iron River, Mich., is one of nine men awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross by Lieut. Gen. George C. Kenney, commander of Allied air forces in the Southwest Pacific. Each man has 200 or more flying hours to his credit.

Jauhiainen was awarded the DFC for 200 hours from Dec. 7, 1941, to March 16, 1942; Oak Leaf Cluster in lieu of a second award of the DFC for 200 hours between March 15 and June 1, 1942, and another Oak Leaf Cluster in lieu of a second award of the Air Medal for 100 hours between August 22 and Nov. 1, 1942.

The citations presented to the men read:

"For extraordinary achievement while participating in 200 hours of operational flight missions in the Southwest Pacific during which hostile contact was probable and expected. These operations consisted of long-range bombing missions against enemy airdrome, harbors, shipping and naval forces. Throughout these flights, outstanding ability and devotion to duty were demonstrated."

### Uutiskirjeitä

#### IRON RIVER, MICH.

— Ironriveriläinen staff-ker-santti Donald Jauhiainen on saanut lentoristin osoittamastaan neuvokkuudesta ja urhoollisuudesta Tyynen meren lounaisosassa toimivien liittoutuneiden lentovoimien komentajalta, kenr.-luutn. George C. Kennyltä. Kahdeksalle muulle annettiin samanlainen risti.

Jauhiainen sai D.F.C:n 200 lentotunnista, jotka hän suoritti jouluk. 7 p. 1941 ja maalisk. 16 p. 1942 välisenä aikana, ja lisäksi kaksi tammenlehti-palkintoa mitaliin kiinnitettäväksi. Ne annettiin hänelle maalisk. 15 p.—kesäk. 1 p. 1942 hänen lentämistään 200 lentotunnista ja elok. 22 p.—mar-rask. 1 p. 1942 suorittamastaan 100 lentotunnista ja niillä saavuttamastaan erinomaisista tuloksista.

Jauhiaisen äidille lähettämässään kirjeessään kenr.-luutn. K. lausuu mitä kunnioittavimman tunnustuksensa Jauhiaisen osoittamasta rohkeudesta ja älykkyydestä useiden retkien aikana, mm. New Icelandiin tehdyn pommituksen kestäessä, jolloin täysosumia saatiin vihollisen hävittäjään ja muihinkin kohteisiin.







Donald Jauhiainen, 68, of Waukegan, Illinois, died April 12, 1984, at Victory Memorial Hospital.

He was born April 12, 1916, in Republic, Michigan. He was a member of the Immanuel Lutheran Church. He was retired from U.S. Steel Corporation. He was a World War II veteran with the 5th Air Force 43rd Unit. He received the Silver Star and an Air Medal with 3 Oak Leaf clusters, the Distinguished Flying Cross with 3 Oak Leaf cluster and the Bomb Command 42nd Oak Leaf cluster. Also received the Distinguished service and Good Conduct Medals, and was a survivor of Pearl Harbor.

He is survived by his wife, Ina; 1 son, William Jauhiainen of Waukegan; 1 daughter, Donna (Richard) McGrigry of Waukegan; 2 granddaughters, Sondra and Shannon; 1 brother, Matt Johanan of West Bend, Wisconsin; and 3 sisters, Mrs. Sylvia (Muzzy) Moska of San Francisco, California, Mrs. Mamie (Van) VanderHook of Severna Park, Maryland, and Mrs. Elvi (Harold) Huebler of Langhorne, Pennsylvania.
