








CASPIAN--Thanks to the appeal, new documents and resources are being turned in to help with the list of mining personnel for the Mining Memorial Hall. Readers should take note that this listing is for all personnel, not just miners, and includes laboratory and office staff, surface workers, police and others in addition to the underground workers.

The most recent acquisition containing names of workers came from the Florence, Wisconsin Historical Society. It is a ledger from the Iron River Mine.

The Iron River Mine had several distinctions. It was the oldest and largest early producer of iron ore on the west side of Iron County. Known by several names, it has been referred to as the Stambaugh Mine and also as the Riverton. The location of the workings was one-quarter mile due west of the initially platted village of Stambaugh and later extended to the Isabella to the south. Preliminary exploration work was done in the spring of 1880.

The ledger dated 1889 to 1896 and contained some headings that would not be unusual such as steam pumps, filling and timbering, drifting, cars/skips/derricks, and shaft house and skip roads, however, reflective of the times were headings such as carts/wagons/sleighs, barns, harnesses and horses.

Some interesting entries include shafts for buggies, \$1; one buggy and cushion, \$43.90; hose cart, \$110; monthly forage (hay), \$200; repairing buffalo robe \$10; curry comb, 25 cents; and two sets of harness collars, \$75. Shoeing horses was a regular expense as was a occasional team rental at \$3.10.

A team was purchased for \$360.

Expenses for the chemical laboratory ran from \$10 to \$50.50 per month. Explosives in 1889 for the period of August through December cost \$12,573.83. Interesting expenditures in the building category included \$2.25 for sweeping the chimney of the superintendent's residence and \$999.37 spent on the Italian Boarding house and \$1,385.59 on Captain Ball's house. An engine house expense was \$10,353.16.

Telegraphy bills were a regular monthly expense and were around \$8 or \$10. Telephone rent in July 1891 was \$28.34.

Names listed on the pay roll were J.N. Porte, superintendent, whose salary was \$187.50 per month and other employees who received \$45 per month. Names of workers may still be familiar today. At the age of 25, Dad left Finland to escape being conscripted into the Russian army. He sailed on "The Saxonia" from England and arrived in Boston on the 9th of March 1907. He became a citizen of the United States on the 7th of Dec. 1914. This is recorded in Volume 6 - Number 1347 - Certificate Number 523557 in Marquette, MI. He applied for a homestead of 160 acres of land in Republic, MI in 1912 and became owner of the land in 1917.

Being single, at the time, he built a one-story-two room house. (24 x 14)

He met Mom in 1914—married - and lived in the original home until Dad built a two-story log cabin in 1920.

From 1912 until 1926, Dad's occupation was a farmer, homesteader. He built a saw mill and blacksmith shop. He hunted, fished and trapped small animals.

In 1918, Dad hired a young, Finnish school teacher. She lived in the original house and taught Eino, Then Donald, Matt and Sylvia. Plus the Neimi and Lyski children in the living room of our home. Sylvia told me that they left the house through the back door and came into the living room through the front door. The only ones to do so!!! Our company always came in the back door!

In 1926, a fire started in one of the barns and spread to the two houses. Very little of the possessions were saved. So Dad had to start over. He went to Iron River and got a job in the iron ores mines. He built a small house on Lay Avenue where we spent the rest of our childhood. We had a wonderful but poor, life. We always had a garden for fresh vegetables. Dad still hunted and fished. We had a cow for milk. Traded the milk for eggs and an occasional chicken for Sunday dinner. We children learned to pick blue berries, Raspberries, blackberries etc. which my mother made into jams and jellies. She canned a lot of the produce from our garden. Dad built a cold cellar in the basement and we always had carrots, potatoes through the winter. So all in all, we were well off. The depression hit many families much harder. Dad died in 1938 and Mom in 1949.

We had a wonderful, happy childhood. So many friends and great neighbors. Dad got trailer loads full of sawdust from the mill and placed it on the empty corner lot. There the boys played baseball and football. At night, we would have a bonfire and sing. Leila Burbeck would play the guitar and someone the harmonica. Dad built us girls a playhouse where we spent many happy hours. We sewed doll clothes by hand and designed new clothes for our paper dolls. We traded movie star pictures like the kid do today with their baseball cards. We jumped rope, played jacks. There would be about two doz or more kids who would get together and play games like -Run my good Sheep run - Kick the can - Red lite-Green Lite. To relax, we would swing on the double seated patio swing Dad built. Mom would bake on Wed and Sat. And, oh, how we loved the warm goodies! On New Year's Eve Dad would Tell our fortunes by the way heated lead would cool into different shapes. And, of course, We believed all of the made up fortunes! Jauhiainen Commended For Bravery

IRON RIVER, July 23—Staff Sgt. Donald Jauhiainen, recently decorated for meritorious service with the Fifth Air Force in Australia, was commended for bravery in a letter received here by his mother, Mrs. Tilda Jauhiainen, 517 Lay avenue, Iron River, from his commanding officer, Lieut. Gen. George C. Kenny.

The letter reads:

"Recently your son, Staff Sgt. Donald Jauhiainen, was decorated with the Air Medal. It was an award made in recognition of courageous service to his combat organization, his fellow American airmen, his country, his home and to you.

"He was cited for meritorious achievement while participating in an aerial fight over Kavieng Harbor, New England.

America's Sons In War

"He was radio operator of a B-17 type aircraft on a night bombing mission against shipping in the vicinity of the harbor. Despite heavy anti-aircraft fire, bombs were dropped and two direct hits were scored on a destroyer. Almost every hour of every day your son and the sons of other American mothers, are doing just such things as that here in the Southwest Pacific.

"There is a very real and very tangible contribution to victory and to peace.

"I would like to tell you how genuinely proud I am to have such as your son in my Command, and how gratified I am to know that young Americans with such courage and resourcefulness are fighting our country's battle against the aggressor nations.

"You, Mrs. Jauhianinen, have every reason to share that pride and gratification."

"Sgt. Jauhiainen has been in the Southwest Pacific more than a year and has been in the service 24 months. He is a radioman on a Flying Fortress.

His brother, Second Lieut. Matt Jauhiainen, is with the Ordnance department in South America.

Iron River Man Awarded Flying Cross

ALLIED HEADQUARTERS IN AUSTRALIA—CP—Staff Sgt. Donald Jauhiainen; of Iron River, Mich., is one of nine men awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross by Lieut. Gen. George C. Kenney, commander of Allied air forces in the Southwest Pacific. Each man has 200 or more flying hours to his credit.

Jauhiainen was awarded the DFC for 200 hours from Dec. 7, 1941, to March 16, 1942; Oak Leaf Cluster in lieu of a second award of the DFC for 200 hours between March 15 and June 1, 1942, and another Oak Leaf Cluster in lieu of a second award of the Air Medal for 100 hours between August 22 and Nov. 1, 1942.

The citations presented to the men read:

"For extraordinary achievement while participating in 200 hours of operational flight missions in the Southwest Pacific during which hostile contact was probable and expected. These operations consisted of long-range bombing missions against enemy airdrome, harbors, shipping and naval forces. Throughout these flights, outstanding ability and devotion to duty were demonstrated."


Donald Jauhiainen, 68, of Waukegan, Illinois, died April 12, 1984, at Victory Memorial Hospital.

the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the
said claimant and to the heirs and assigns of the said
claimant forever.
